OLYMPIA FENCERS WIN GOLD, SILVER AND BRONZE AT CHICAGO YOUTH TOURNAMENT

ST. LOUIS, JANUARY 21, 2009... Fencers from St. Louis-based Olympia Fencing Academy won gold, silver and bronze medals at the Chicago Lakeshore Regional Youth Circuit Tournament held at the Lakeshore Athletic Club Lincoln Park on January 17 – 18.

Bringing home the gold for Olympia was Mohamed Hassan, who won the youth mixed foil event, ages 12 and under. Tom Davis won the silver medal in the youth mixed sabre event, ages 14 and under. Several more Olympia fencers had strong performances as well:

- Nehal Hassan placed 10th overall in the mixed sabre, youth 14 event, and was awarded a silver medal for being the second place female in that event.
- Joe Davis placed 5th overall in the mixed sabre, youth 12 event, and was awarded a bronze medal for being the third place male in that event.
- John Dunagan, 6th place, mixed foil, ages 14 and under.

Other Olympia fencers who participated included Charles Halbeck (foil and epee), Emerson Reed (sabre); and Steven Shearing (sabre).

“This was Olympia’s first visit to this prestigious regional tournament, and we’re very proud of our strong showing,” said Paula Reed, spokesperson for Olympia Fencing Academy. “There were participants from fencing clubs across the Midwest, and we’re looking forward to seeing them at our own regional youth tournament in St. Louis, currently planned for late February.”

Sanctioned by the United States Fencing Association (USFA), Olympia Fencing Academy is the training facility for several nationally ranked fencers who regularly compete around the country, as well as for dozens of recreational fencers of all ages and skill levels who simply enjoy the strategy, athleticism and camaraderie of the sport. The Academy’s head coach, Hossam Hassan, has 27 years of fencing experience and holds nine certifications and degrees from the French Fencing Federation and International Olympic Committee.
